### **Mining Companies Launch the Yukon Mine Training Trust Fund**

Specifically, 5 mining companies have contributed a total of \$150,000 to launch this new initiative and provide funds for future training projects to be developed and delivered for Yukoners wishing to work in mining and related resources industries. Sherwood Copper Corp.; Yukon Zinc Corp.; North American Tungsten Corporation Ltd.; Alexco Resources Ltd. and Selwyn Resources Ltd. each offered funds to help establish the Trust Fund and provide assistance to the YMTA to undertake necessary planning and implementation activities to ensure successful training in the future.
